Action

- How often do you read through your child's work with them?
- 2. When your child's work is assessed, look together for comments in
  - **GREEN** from the teacher
  - WWW, EBI, ACTION
- 3. With your child, talk through how your child might redraft any actions
- 4. Your child should independently *redraft* any actions in **PURPLE**.
- 5. Ask your child how and why the redrafted version is better

## The Critical Issue of Literacy - Reading

- The average reading age of an exam paper is 15 years and 7 months.
- Children who read for pleasure at the right chronological level in their spare time perform significantly better at school than other pupils.
- Exam success depends on a child's ability to read at the right chronological level so reading should be a significant feature at school but also at home.

Reading age: 8




